



COORDINATED ENTRY: Prioritization of Chronically Homeless and Other Vulnerable Populations in Permanent Supportive Housing.

This policy is intended to comply with HUD CPD Notice 16 -11 and shall be part of the Coordinated Entry Written Standards.

ORDER of PRIORITY (Non-chronic)

All CoC funded PSH beds not currently dedicated as beds for the chronically homeless shall be prioritized for the chronically homeless. Persons referred to PSH programs will follow this prioritization in a manner that is consistent with the project’s HUD grant agreement.

When there are no chronically homeless households that meet the criteria set forth in the projects’ HUD grant agreement, the following priority shall be followed as set forth in HUD CPD Notice 16-11. (SAFE Havens are not included as the CoC does not have SAFE Havens.)

1. Household has documented homelessness on the street or in shelter for at cumulative total of at least 12 months but less than 4 occasions and there are severe service needs. Prioritize by longest time homeless.
2. Household has documented homelessness on the streets or in shelter for less than 12 months total with severe service needs. Prioritize by longest time homeless.
3. Household on street or in shelter without severe service needs. Prioritize by longest time homeless.
4. Household coming from transitional housing based on severity of service needs. Prioritize by longest time homeless.
