Presentation: IMPACT 211 and Beyond Presented by: Emily Kenney, LCSW, Director of Systems Change, IMPACT, Inc.

IMPACT's mission is to change lives, for good.

Serving Southeastern Wisconsin for more than 60 years. IMPACT, Inc. assess and guide those experiencing personal crisis toward resources to achieve stability; and collaborate with community partners to foster system improvement.

In 1969-70 the organization started as Underground Switchboard hotline. Georgia was the first state to launch the use of 211 digits to access information on a community level. In 2000 the IMPACT, Inc. community information line began with the consolidation of five sperate hotlines operated by IMPACT...precursor of 211. In 2002, 211 service began in Milwaukee County. United Ways throughout the nation operated a community 211. The United Way of Wisconsin collective support IMPACT, Inc. and other local operated United Way's 211.

In 2008 to present IMPACT, Inc. assists local Emergency Management offices with aftermath of disasters and public health emergencies including the 2010 flooding disaster in Milwaukee County and most recently the Burlington floods. In 2013, IMPACT, Inc. was used for the Emergency Housing Coordinated Entry for Milwaukee County. Most recently, IMPACT, Inc. launched IMPACT Connect.

IMPACT 211 covers nine counties in southeastern Wisconsin which includes Milwaukee, Waukesha, Kenosha, Racine, Ozaukee, Washington, Dodge, Jefferson, and Walworth counties. The help line connects people who need resources to the right agencies. Such as; assistance with food, clothing and other basic needs.

IMPACT Connect

People want a way to connect directly to resources and there is a desire to come together to address gaps in service. IMPACT Connect follows the community Information Exchange toolkit from 211 San Diego. This product is based on the health information exchanges throughout the nation. This includes a tool to screen and match client needs to community resources. A platform to communicate across agencies sectors. A process to bring agencies together for the collective impact of addressing client needs, informed by network-wide data. IMPACT, Inc. is working with United US. Core components of IMPACT Connect is network, shared language, resource database and closed-loop referrals and technology platform and data integration.

LIFT Wisconsin

LIFT Wisconsin an online legal service provider. They offer online criminal and eviction record removal services along with assistance to resolve your specific driver's license issue. Using Legal Tune up to search the DOT's reinstatement database to find the reason for your suspension or revocation. There are tips to help with all types of driver's license problems, pay or take care of unpaid fines, reinstate your license with the DMV. This is a free serve.

United Way of Racine County- Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) <u>www.unitedwayracine.org/vita</u> Appointments are available for the VITA services. VITA is a national program staffed by local volunteers to provide free preparation and electronic filing of tax returns.

Region 2 DCC - Laurie Bauer

Racine County has NaloxBoxes (Opioid Rescue Kits) available. The box can be mounted on the wall or can be set on a cabinet. Inside the box are a rescue mask, Narcan kit (2 doses), What To Do Next card, Quick Start Guide on how to use Narcan, and pack of small cards that has what to do in case of overdose. Doses are available to hand out or help for those entering the COP Houses. If you wish to have a box for your agency please contact 262-638-6375. The County will now include test kits with their free community Narcan trainings and will also have tests available on a walk-in basis at the Dennis Kornwolf Service Center, located at 1717 Taylor Ave. The purpose of fentanyl test strips is to allow the user to test the substance before using it to determine if fentanyl is present. For more information about the free test kits or other treatment resources, please contact the Opioid Resource Hotline at 262-638-6375. The County is also working on getting defibrillators in all the offices.
